#### The Rush of Lent

It seems like just yesterday that we were celebrating Christmas and the New Year. (Ok, for me that might because I am still working on getting Christmas decorations down) We gathered together to celebrate and praise God for the birth of Jesus, for the one who is God incarnate, and for the coming promise of salvation. It is a great time of praise and thanksgiving, and it seems to fly by almost as quickly as it comes.

What follows is a season that is vastly different from the season of Christmas. On the tails of the season of celebration is a season of reflection and introspection, of atonement and reconciliation. The season of Lent quickly approaches as we march forward out of the season of Christmas and we go from glory and joy to a time of risk, a time of trouble, and a time of soul-wrenching contemplation of what we have done and what we have left undone.

New Testament scholar and professor Amy-Jill Levine tells us in her book "Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week" that Lent is a season that asks us to take a risk by reflecting on our lives, our relationships, the things that we have done and the things we have failed to do. Levine suggests that Holy Week offers us a unique snapshot into a risk of Lent, seeing Jesus riding into Jerusalem as a king, smashing the tables in the temple, preaching the Temple and sharing a meal with his followers. But Holy Week also offers an opportunity of to examine those around Jesus, what they did and didn't do, and the risks they took and didn't take. Levine offers that Lent challenges us to

choose to understand what it is that we stand for, what it is we believe in, what is the cross that we are bearing. It is also a time to reflect on what we have denied and betrayed and how we can make it right.

As we enter the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, I invite you to take time during this season to reflect - to reflect on Holy Week, on the risks Jesus took and those that the disciples didn't, on the things we have done that our sister or brother that we need to reconcile, on what we are willing to risk to follow Jesus and take up our cross. Take time in mediation and prayer. To consider how the events of Holy Week impact our lives. Dr. Levine states, "During Lent you have the opportunity to think about your life alongside the life of Jesus, inviting inward transformation and then outward action". What does that mean for us, and how is the life of Jesus, especially the events and choices made during Holy Week, reflected in our lives.

I invite you to spend this season of Lent studying the events of Holy Week. Read the story in each of the Gospels, think about the stories of Jesus and his followers, of the religious leadership, of Pilate and Herod. Think about the choices made, the risks taken, the decisions made and what they mean for us today, both as people of faith and as a community of faith. May the Holy Spirit move in us to allow the stories to transform us and to move us to action, for the good of the Gospel and salvation for all.

## Revising the Church Constitution

Behind the scene, the committees and officers of first Christian Church have been revising the church constitution. The goal is to update our constitution to reflect many changes that have occurred since it was last revised in 1992. Since then, for instance, we have created a worship committee and a technology committee. And we have affirmed a new vision for the church of connecting us to Christ, to each other and to our community.


Disciples of Christ churches put the final decision on the approval of any change in the constitution into the hands of the congregation. As the current moderator of the board, I write now to inform every member of the church that I anticipate that the process of revising the constitution will result in a February vote of the board to recommend the revised constitution to the congregation for its approval.

In accordance with our current constitution that board recommendation will start an official process of setting a date for the vote, making copies of the revised constitution available, indicating how it is revised, then announcing the set date for two weeks, after with the congregational meeting will be held following worship.

The entire revision process began back in 2016, when my predecessor as moderator, Ron Morlock, created a special committee whose recommendations has now been studied and in some cases modified by affected church officers and committees. I pray that the revisions we approve as a congregation will enable our Christian lives together over the generation to come.

## FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH OF BOWLING GREEN BOARD MEETING DECEMBER 12, 2019

The December 12, 2019 church board meeting of Christian Church was held at the church and called to order by Vice-Moderator, Claude Kilpatrick at 7:30pm. Members present were Claude Kilpatrick, Pastor Matt Every, Sid Sink, Steve Riewaldt, Ruth Maltby, Ron and Diane Morlock, Don and Char Scherer, and Patty Hollabaugh.

Opening prayer and devotion was given by Pastor Matt Every. The January 9, 2020 devotion will be given by Ruth Maltby.

#### **Church Business**

There were no additional agenda ideas to be added.

The November 14, 2019 minutes were reviewed. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Sid Sink and seconded by Claude Kilpatrick. Motion carried.

Moderator Don Scherer arrived and assumed the position of conducting the meeting.

The Financial report was given by Sid Sink. The 2020 Budget was approved by the congregation following the worship service on Sunday December 8, 2019. The report was accepted as presented.

Clerks report showed one addition, Patty Hollabaugh.

The property committee met this evening to discuss the following:

Trees and shrubbery on the property

Rental fees for use of the church and form completion for use of church for non-church related activities

Purchase of a new desk for Administrative Assistant

Controls for church boilers

Outreach program for elderly members

The Men's Group report was given by Steve Riewaldt. \$200 was donated by the Men's Group towards Camp Christian cabin renovation and repair, with additional donations of monies being sent to various organizations. The group will sponsor a family for Christmas. Work is being done on the cabins at Camp Christian. There is about \$300,000 of work that needs to be completed prior to next summer camp dates.

The Personnel Committee met last week. Jon Steingas has been hired as the musician for the December 15 church service. The committee is working on hiring a musician to play for the choir and Sunday worship. Ruth Maltby has signed a contract for the coming year.

Technology purchased two computers and received one donated computer that is able to handle the needs of the church including videos, etc. One of the computers will be for Pastor Matt, one for the Administrative Assistant Laura, and one for the church technology. New software needs to

be evaluated for the church financial needs.

The Worship committee met on December 2 to discuss Advent and Christmas Eve services, as well as services for Epiphany and Lent.

The pastor's class on Thursdays at Grounds for Thought began December 5, 2019 with good attendance.

The Women's group is meeting regularly to continue their study.

The Hospitality Committee met to discuss snacks to follow the Christmas Eve service. They will be sponsoring a bakepotato bar on February 2, 2020. The chili cook-off will be January 19, 2020.

#### Ministry of the Church

The Pastor's report is on file. The Interfaith Breakfast committee met to plan a breakfast for April 21, 2020 to be held at the new building at City Park. Brenda Kirkbride was visited by Pastor Matt awhile she was in the hospital. Pastor Matt also visited Brian Tucker and talked with Carla Meredith.

#### **Old Business**

Don Scherer will send out the revised bylaws that will be reviewed at the January 9, 2020 board meeting. The Constitution and Bylaws will then be approved at a future board meeting.

#### New Business

Pastor Matt was contacted by a group from the BG Chamber of Commerce regarding the possibility of doing a professional video which will be put on the commerce website for 4 years. A 60 second video would cost \$4500, a 30 second video would \$2500, and the organization's logo would cost \$2,000. Diane Morlock moved that we move forward to investigate this opportunity, Ruth Maltby seconded, motion passed. Pastor Matt will put together a committee for the investigation and will report back at the next board meeting.

Steve Riewaldt reported that Safety and Security has contacted Wood County Hospital to have updated defibrillator training for members of the church.
